In the practice of its Mission, "To broadly contribute to society through value creation based on innovative research and development activities for the betterment of healthcare and fuller lives of people worldwide," the Sumitomo Pharma Group not only provides innovative products and healthcare solutions, but also places importance on collaboration with local communities and society. Based on our Group Mission and Values (values that should be shared by all executives and employees), we aim to solve social issues in three categories in order to help people live healthier and more fulfilling lives: "Support for Medical Care and Health," "Initiatives to Develop the Next Generation" for future leaders in society, and "Support for Local Communities and Disasters Relief" to realize a sustainable society.

Support for Medical Care and Health

We work in collaboration with society to do what we can to help people live healthy lives, including contributing to medical care and health.

Support for Patients and Their Families

Under the Slogan of "Innovation today, healthier tomorrows," Sumitomo Pharma engages in social contribution activities with the aim of "Allowing all patients and their families to lead healthy, fulfilled lives."

Supporting the Creation of "Kiwanis Dolls" for Hospitalized Children

Since fiscal 2015 we have supported the creation of Kiwanis dolls that comfort hospitalized children. Kiwanis dolls are plain, white, cotton-filled dolls, and used in explanations to children of the medical treatment they will receive. Pictures illustrating treatments are drawn on the white dolls or they are used to simulate surgery or injections, to relieve children's fear or anxiety concerning treatment. However, the dolls are not only used to explain treatment; children in hospital can have fun drawing faces or clothes on them so they are like "little friends" to children during their stays in hospital. Our employees actively contribute to the creation process by crafting doll shapes from white fabric and filling them with soft cotton. Once completed, these Kiwanis Dolls are then presented to children through the efforts of the Kiwanis Club.

Participating in the Summer Camp "Ganbare Kyowakoku"

We have participated in the summer camp "Ganbare Kyowakoku" organized by Certified NPO "The Support Network for NANBYO Children of Japan" since fiscal 2013. The camp aims to provide opportunities for children requiring medical care and their families to enjoy various extraordinary experiences such as playing in nature, singing, and interacting with friends, with the motto of "Let's make friends." It is extremely challenging for families with children requiring medical care to go on overnight trips. However, "Ganbare Kyowakoku" is a camp where children requiring medical care are continuously supported by dedicated volunteer medical staff, while other volunteer staff members engage in activities with their healthy siblings. Our employees participated as volunteer staff, aiming to provide a camp experience where all parents and children can truly enjoy with peace of mind.

The Japan Epilepsy Research Foundation (JERF) was originally founded in commemoration of the 90th anniversary of the foundation of former Dainippon Pharmaceutical. The Foundation's purpose is to promote therapeutic research in the field of epilepsy and contribute to the healthcare and well-being of the general public. Subsequently, the Foundation gained a fresh start as a public interest incorporated foundation after being authorized as qualifying for the new public interest corporation system. Operated based on contributions from Sumitomo Pharma and other donors, the Foundation provides grants and commendations, holds meetings for reporting research results as forums for announcing its grants and commendations, and publishes an annual research newsletter.

In fiscal 2023, we provided 12 research grants and one overseas study grants. Sumitomo Pharma will continue to contribute to improvements in healthcare and welfare through its support for JERF.

Our lessons have Sumitomo Pharma young researchers as lectures who explain mainly their own work in the area of drug discovery research.



Lessons Involving Comprehensive Inquiry into Life and Ethics

Since 2012, Sumitomo Pharma has been providing on-site lessons at junior and senior high schools with employees as instructors. To date, they have been given at more than 160 junior and senior high schools for over 14,000 students. Since 2020, they have been conducted according to our own program at senior high schools to have students think for themselves about issues that lie ahead in advances made in science and technology in the areas of genome analysis and heredity. The program aims to cultivate students' ability to address difficult questions about life and ethics, for which there are no correct answers, by encouraging them to develop their own views and reach their own conclusions, while accepting the different opinions of others (diversity). It can be implemented not only for biology lessons but also for integrated studies and lessons on society (contemporary society) and has received high praise from teachers at schools where it has been provided.

This education program won the Award of Excellence in the 13th Career Education Award (large enterprise category) organized by the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI).

Providing Cocowork Vegetables to Children's Community Cafeterias

We are working on providing vegetables grown by our special subsidiary, Cocowork Co. Ltd.

(hereafter referred to as "Cocowork") to community children's cafeterias (in Toyonaka City and Suita City).

Children's cafeterias are held for the purpose of preventing children from eating alone and creating a safe and comfortable place for them in the community, however, in reality, many children's cafeterias struggle to secure food because they provide meals on a limited budget. Through the provision of Cocowork's nutritious vegetables, we aspire to support the healthy development of children and introduce them the joys and deliciousness of fresh produce, especially those who may dislike vegetables.
